Attendance Awards

We are happy to announce that we will be holding our termly attendance awards for this summer term. Children who have been in school every day during this term, for both the morning and afternoon session, will be awarded with a Gold award. There will also be a Silver and Bronze award. Please see the table below to show the percentage mark they require to achieve these awards:

SILVER	98 - 99.9%
BRONZE	96 – 97.9%



Any children who are off due to medical appointments, religious observance or for any other exceptional circumstances, will be marked as an authorised absence, but as they were not in school, they will not receive 100%.

It is important that your child attends school every day and is punctual. Attending school every day will give your child the best chances in life and evidence suggests that regular attendance equals greater opportunity. Teaching starts when school starts, therefore, your child will never miss out on important lessons if they are on time. The start of the school day is an opportunity to further develop important social skills with each other, children and adults. It is important to establish good habits now. It all adds up!

We do request that you try and make any appointments outside of school hours, but we know sometimes, this cannot be avoided. We therefore request that you provide the school with evidence of any such appointments.

Applications are free and the deadline for applying is 30 June 2021. Settled status for EU citizens will guarantee access to:

- The right to remain in the UK
- Public services, such as healthcare and education
- Public funds and pensions
- British citizenship (which can be applied for at a later date)
