#### \*PLEASE NOTE CHANGES TO START AND END OF DAY FROM JUNE 7TH\*

From Monday 7th June, there will be some changes to the start and to the end of the school day. The changes are being introduced to reflect some of the reduced restrictions that have been introduced recently. However, we are continuing to keep children apart as much as possible still, and lunch and break times in school are still operating under a bubble system.

#### GATES WILL OPEN AT 8.40am and CLOSE AT 8.55am.

A number of children are arriving after 9am. Lessons start at 9am so please ensure your child is in school ON TIME ready to start learning at 9am. If you arrive after the gates have closed then you will need to sign your child in at the front entrance of the school.

YEAR 2 will enter the school via the Kingsdown Avenue entrance - they will no longer enter via the hall doors near the front entrance of the school.

AT END OF DAY GATES WILL OPEN AT 3:05PM - ONLY KEY STAGE 1 CHILDREN (Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 classes) WILL BE DISMISSED FROM 3.05PM-3.15PM. Reception will be dismissed from the classroom door as normal.

Year 1 will be dismissed from the classroom door as normal

Year 2 will be dismissed from the school prayer garden.

AT 3.15PM, KEY STAGE 2 TEACHERS (Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 staff will dismiss children from the school playground).

Year 3 will line up near the canopy (at the back of the Year 1 classroom) and will get dismissed from there.

Year 4 will line up along the wall underneath the Key Stage 1 playground. Year 5 and Year 6 will stand on the Key Stage 1 playground and will be dismissed from there.

PLEASE NOTE: Any parents of Key Stage 2 children arriving at 3.05pm, will not be able to collect their child until 3.15pm when the class teacher brings them outside. We will no longer be using the walky talky system for dismissal.

We continue to keep all the year groups separated but we recognise that there will be more adults around on the playground than we are use to. PLEASE keep yourselves safe and stay at a safe distance from others and PLEASE WEAR A MASK on the school site. We ask that parents DO NOT STAND AND CHAT but EXIT IMMEDIATELY once children have been collected. We continue to use the one way gate system and we continue to use multiple gates around the school whereby parents can access and exit through.

### WHAT'S THE ISSUE?

Children are being coerced into carrying drugs across the country by gangs and dealers, which has lead to an 807% increase in modern slavery in the UK. The issue is especially prominent in Birmingham, with approximately 100 County Lines running in and out of the city.
