Parking Outside School




Recently, Community Police Officers turned up to observe parking one morning outside school and concluded that a number of parents are parking inconsiderately and sometimes unlawfully. The area outside the main gates on Kingsdown Avenue is particularly hazardous, as children and parents try to cross the road and vehicles regularly pull up right in front of the zig-zag lines or the railings next to the gates whilst other cars are impatient and try to

squeeze past.

As a result of what the officers witnessed, they have promised to become more of a presence over the coming months. In addition, they have been in touch to request that senior school staff take photos of any vehicles causing a danger to others or parked unlawfully and forward these on to them. We sincerely hope it doesn't come to this, but we do request that you park considerately. There have been several very close calls recently. We have also been in touch with the council and ensured that Kingsdown Ave has been added to the gritting route, as the ice caused further problems last week.

The school gates are open from 8.40-8.55am. The main traffic problems occur around 8.55. Please try to get to school in good time in order to provide a smooth start to the morning and ensure children are relaxed and ready to learn. Our school PCSOs will continue to monitor when they can, and we still give out badges to those who use safer, environmentally friendly ways to travel to school, including the park and stride option. We are going to become stricter in terms of locking the gates at 8.55 and will continue to monitor the parking situation closely.
