## ATTENDANCE MATTERS


Regular attendance at school is crucial in raising standards of education and in ensuring every child can fulfil their God-given potential here at St. Mark's. Missing out on lessons leaves children vulnerable to falling behind, therefore, our aim is to maintain our high expectations of attendance by working closely with parents and carers.

In the few weeks we have been back at school, there have been a higher than average number of unauthorised absences and as a result, I have requested meetings with parents of these children.

I understand that holidays in school time are cheaper for families, but the implication this has on children's learning and wellbeing, particularly at the start of the new academic year is detrimental. We want to work closely with families to improve attendance and punctuality, as this is essential for children's future working adult life. In the same way we wouldn't go on holiday from work without first requesting it from management, holidays should not be taken in term time. **Parents have a legal duty to ensure children attend school every day that the school is open except in a small number of allowable circumstances such as being too ill to attend or being given permission for an absence in advance from the school.**
