Extra-curricular activities

We are delighted to announce that after half term, we will be providing a range of extra curricular activities (some new to St. Mark's). We have made the decision to not provide morning extra curricular clubs as we had a number of children that often arrived late last year. When children arrive late to clubs in the morning, it means the club can't start on time and it causes disruption to the group activity. Please note that all clubs will start the **second week back** at school (week beginning 13th November). A letter to apply to the clubs on offer will go out on Monday 6th November and places will be booked on first come first served basis with priority for the pupil premium children, but please recognise that we want as many children as possible to have the opportunity to attend an after school club so we will be keeping a record of who is attending a club so that if your child does not get a space this time then we would hope that they get a space next time.

As well as weekly after school clubs, we are also going to provide some 'one-off' clubs to reflect the liturgical season:

KS1 Christmas wool decoration club - Tuesday 21st November 3:15-4:15pm

KS2 Christmas decoration club (salt dough designs) - Friday 24th November 3:15-4:15pm

KS2 Christmas decoration club (painting salt dough and other crafts—Monday 27th November 3:15-4:15pm

As we are offering a wider range of after school clubs, we have changed our prices, weekly after school clubs will now cost £2.50 per session (£15 for 6 weeks). Mrs. Hussain will set up payment tabs on the school gateway the first week back to enable you as parents to pay for clubs after you have received confirmation that your child has a place in the club.
