The Knights of Saint Columba will vote for the winners and there are cash prizes for winners and their



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

Thank you for your generous contribution of food this autumn.

Your support will enable us to work with homeless people, children and families as well as older people, refugees and vulnerable migrants and people with severe and complex disabilities. Our work, made possible thanks to your support, brings light to people during their darkest times, and offers them hope and opportunities for the future.

One example of this is the Father Hudson's Care Family Support Service. Our Family Support Workers are based in Catholic Schools around the Archdiocese to support pupils and their families as they work to overcome challenges that are negatively affecting a childs welfare or academic attainment.
