# PARENT COMMUNICATION ON CLASS DOJO

#### Proudly and joyfully, we love, live and learn as God's children

The partnership between school and home plays a crucial role in the holistic development and success of children. We are committed to ensuring your child is able to thrive in school and fulfil their God-given potential. I must emphasise the importance in supporting us on a daily basis in setting high expectations for each of our pupils. It is also significant to emphasise the importance of trust in our teachers. Teachers make many decisions each day for the wellbeing and benefit of pupils and have strong and thorough policies to follow, ratified by our governing body, which cover all areas of school life.

We understand that there are times when concerns or questions arise and we encourage open dialogue. However, it is crucial that interactions remain respectful and courteous, focused on finding constructive solutions. I have read a number of messages sent to staff recently whereby parents have been discourteous and this has caused some upset. Similarly, I have been informed by a number of parents that they have been approached by other parents about issues they believe to be present in the classroom or school. As a school, we will contact parents directly in relation to any issues involving their own children as speculation or misinformation is not constructive.

To ensure that all of our school community are treated with dignity, please see our new Parent Code of Conduct which states clearly the expectations for every parent. Any parent not adhering to our new policy should expect to receive feedback from me. Should parents continue to use the Class Dojo messaging system incorrectly by making demands of teachers, sending rants to teachers and sarcastic comments, we will have to make the decision to stop Class Dojo messaging and revert back to a previous system of communicating with staff via the school office. Parent feedback demonstrates that Class Dojo is a highly valued tool used to communicate with staff, to find out what your children are learning about and also to view homework etc - playing a crucial role in forming partnership between home and school.

I would like to add that the majority of parents do use Class Dojo correctly and are courteous and supportive and this does not go unnoticed.

Here are some of their book reviews to inspire you with what to read next:




#### Mega Monster by David Walliams - recommended by Zuzanna Y6
