### New Food & Recycling Legislation, effective from 1st April 2025

In line with government guidelines, all schools in England must comply with the new regulations. From 31 March 2025, recycling and collection measures for all types of recyclable waste are required to be in place in schools. Any schools that fail to comply with the new regulations will face fines, enforcement actions, and potentially prosecution. To comply with the new legislation, from next week w/c 31.03.2025, we will be putting the following in place: -

- New bins have been placed around school/classrooms to segregate mixed recycling, food waste & general waste items.
  - o Lime Green Bins Mixed Recycling
  - o Dark Green Bins Food waste
  - o Grey/Red Bins General Waste
- Sandwich pupils will no longer be able to empty their left-over food at school. This will need to be taken home from Monday. This way, parents will also be able to monitor what their child has eaten on the day.

All mixed recycling, including cardboard, plastics, glass, and metal, should be carefully separated and disposed of in accordance with the new guidelines to ensure that each material is recycled appropriately and to minimise environmental impact. Pupils will be informed about this at Monday's assembly led by Mrs Linley.

## Cerebral Palsy Awareness Month Aideen Blackborough Visit

To celebrate cerebral palsy awareness month, we received a visit from Aideen Blackborough.

Aideen came to talk to all of us to raise awareness of Cerebral Palsy. Aideen talked about how she lives with her disability and how we can support people with disabilities through our everyday actions. All of the children asked some thoughtful questions and discussed all of our unique abilities and how we are all different.

If you want to find out more, Aideen has written her own book about her experience which Mrs Dykes has started reading.
